A house cannot be made too airtight.

Appropriate mechanical ventilation ensures that a home still exchanges air. **Mechanical ventilation is controlled** and preserves the temperature, humidity, and quality of your air.



An airtight seal does not prevent all air exchange, only uncontrolled air infiltration.

A house with an airtight seal can still facilitate air exchange through mechanical and natural ventilation.

A home with an airtight seal and mechanical ventilation nets significantly less energy use.
